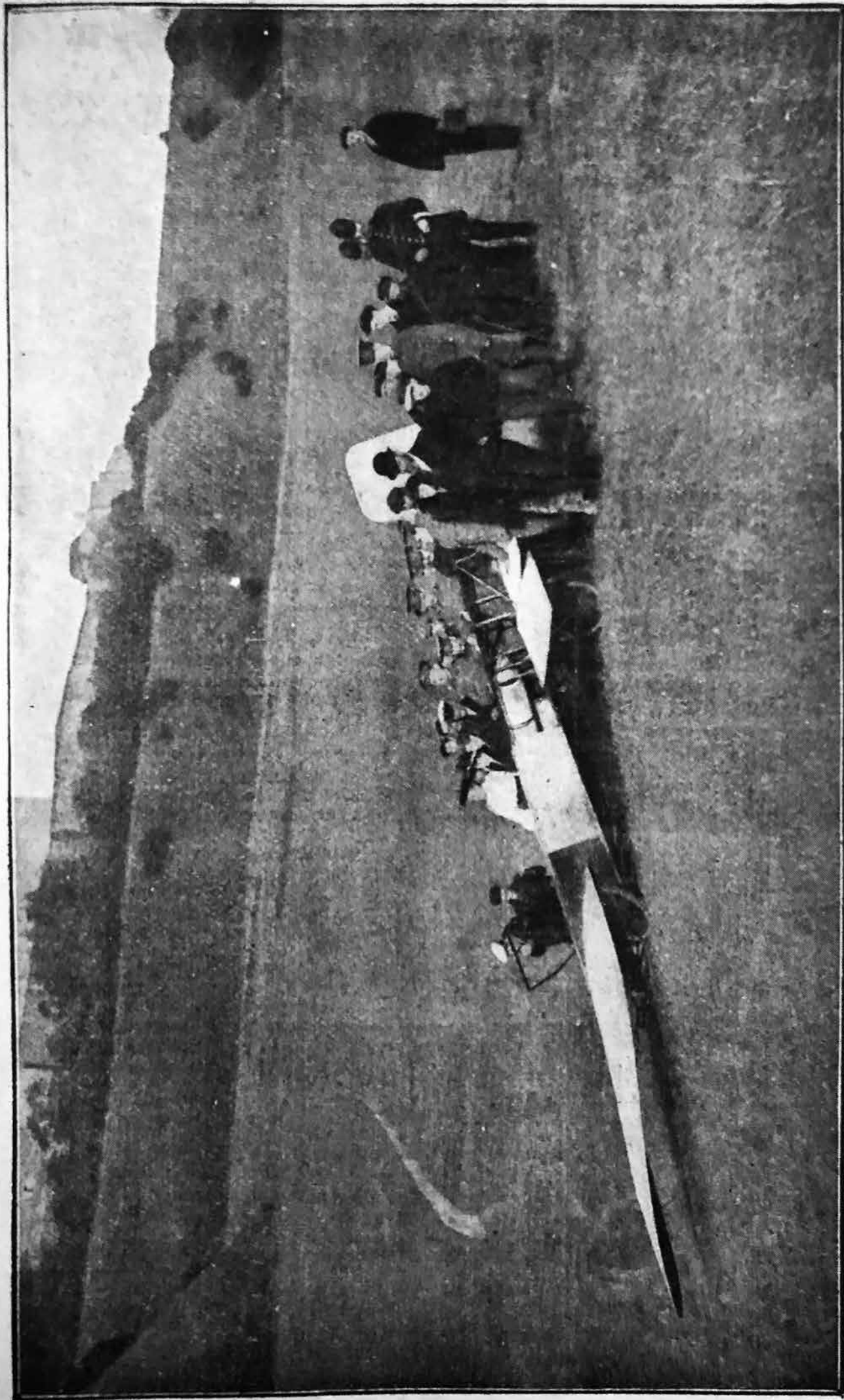

# POST OFFICE INFORMATION.

## Inland Letters.

THESE include Letters passing between places in the United Kingdom, and also the Orkney, Shetland, Scilly, and Channel Islands, and the Isle of Man. The rates of prepaid postage are:—

For letter under 4 ozs., 1d., and at the rate of  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for every additional 2 ozs.

## Foreign and Colonial Letters.

THE rate of prepaid postage to most British Colonies, Possessions and Protectorates is 1d. per 1 oz., and to all other parts of the world,  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d. per 1 oz.,  $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. each additional oz. No letter for a colony or Foreign Country may exceed 2 ft. in length, or 1 ft. in width or depth.

## Registration of Letters.

By the prepayment of a fee of two pence, any letter, newspaper, or book packet may be registered to any place in the United Kingdom or the

British Colonies. Registered letter envelopes, bearing a twopenny stamp embossed on the flap for the payment of the registration fee, are to be purchased of different sizes.

## Post Cards.

POST-CARDS, available for transmission in the United Kingdom only, 10 for 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ d., or stouter quality, 10 for 6d. They can also be had in smaller numbers or singly.

Stout Reply Post Cards are sold at 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each, or 5 for 6d. Thin Reply Post Cards are charged 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each, or 5 for 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ d.

Foreign Post Cards, 1d. each. Reply ditto, 2d. each.

## Private Cards.

A PRIVATE Card becomes a Post Card when it has a half-penny stamp affixed to its face. It must be composed of ordinary cardboard, and not thicker than the material used for the Official Post Card.

Private Cards must not in

any case exceed 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches by 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches, nor must they be less than 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches by 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches in size. The essential feature of the Private Post Card is that it must be prepaid.

## Book Post.

THE Book Post rate, Inland and Foreign, is one half-penny for every 2 ozs., or fraction of 2 ozs. Every book packet must be posted either without a cover, or in a cover entirely open at the ends.

## Newspapers.

THE prepaid postage on every registered inland newspaper is one half-penny.

Newspapers may be posted either without cover or in a cover with the ends open.

## Parcels Post

At any Post Office in the United Kingdom, parcels are now received for transmission at the following charges:—not exceeding 1 lb., 3d.;

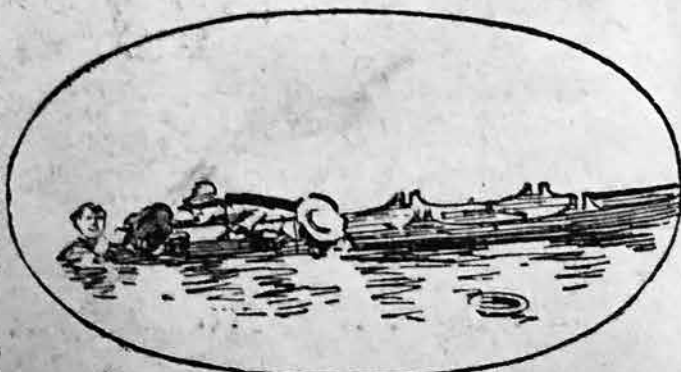
