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Introduction to Cumnock Old Cemetery Monumental Inscriptions

During some family history research in 2010 I came across a copy of Cumnock and Doon Valley Monumental Inscriptions, indexes and maps on a website which included, amongst others, the Old Cemetery on Barrhill Road, Cumnock. This intrigued me as I had relations buried there.

Three years later when Cumnock History Group (CHG) was formed it was proposed to use these documents as the basis for a year long project to examine and record the headstones in the cemetery – a visual stocktaking and assessment.

When Tony Campbell joined the group we learned that it was he who had published the original inscriptions. He had found them in Cumnock Library a few years earlier but they were in a poor condition. When the Baird Institute archives was relocated to the Burns Monument Centre in Kilmarnock he found the original typed manuscripts and layout diagrams and was granted permission to copy them. It would appear that the inscriptions were gathered sometime in the late 1970's or early 1980's by a Manpower Services Commission project team. Their task was to record all pre 1918 monumental inscriptions and war memorials in the area covered by the former Cumnock and Doon Valley District Council.

In 2014 a small group of dedicated CHG members, Mary Dalglish, Morag Gordon, Mary Little and Bobby Grierson, spent the year photographing and cross-checking over 500 headstones with these inscriptions. It quickly became apparent that although many of the headstones were in good condition, many others had either seen marked erosion, disappeared, been vandalized, were overturned or were inaccessible due to overgrown shrubs, trees or undergrowth. We also found some headstones that were not recorded in the original project. We found that some important information on the headstones themselves had been omitted.

We now publish this new updated inscriptions free of charge on our website. There will also be an accompanying USB Flashdrive loaded with a large pdf booklet of over 500 high quality photographs showing each headstone alongside the relevant inscription plus many added extras. This will be available for purchase on our site with any funds raised from sales being used to undertake further research into the history and heritage of Cumnock.

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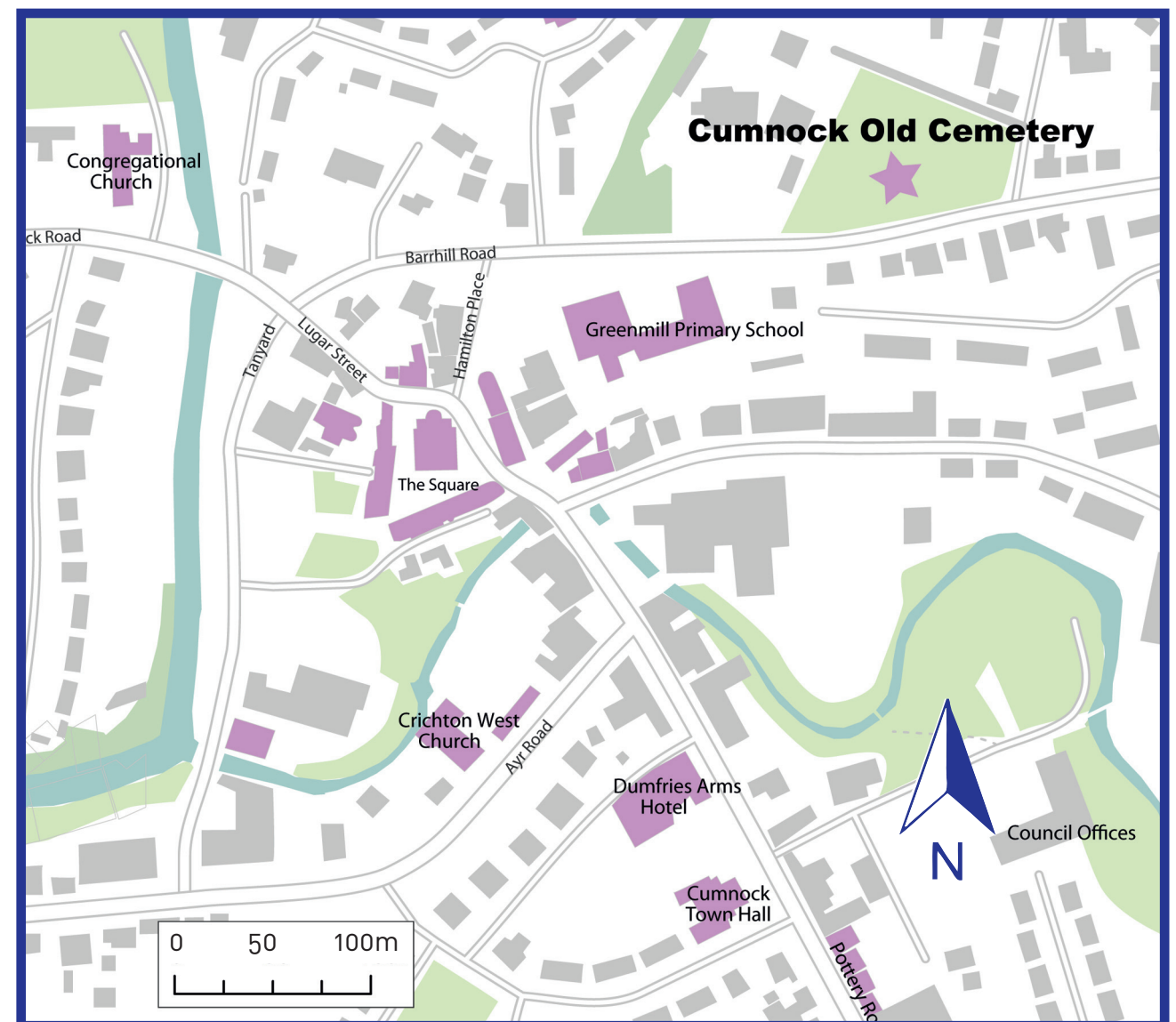

History of Cumnock old cemetery – by George Scott

Hundreds of years ago Cumnock people buried their dead in the Kirkyard – the area round the Parish Church, which we now know as The Square. This practice came to an end around 1768, but interments were being carried out in the ground adjacent to the Gallows Hill, on the Barrhill from 1756. Several Covenanters had been buried there, in the shadow of the scaffold, in the 17th century, 'out of contempt'. But such was the reputation of these martyrs, that the Cumnock people had no qualms about burying their dead in adjacent lairs.

After 1877, following the laying-out of a new cemetery beyond the New Station on Glaisnock Road, fewer burials were carried out at the Barrhill site, and only citizens who owned lairs in the old graveyard were entitled to arrange burials there. Occasional burials have been carried out in such family lairs within living memory.

A visit to this cemetery is of great interest. Even the limited wording on most of the headstones and memorials can give an impression of the way of life in those far-off days.



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Notable and interesting headstones

Here are a few examples of the interesting information etched on the stones:-

30 - John Johnston, who was born in Sanquhar, and died in Cumnock in 1880, aged 99, had fought under Lord Nelson at Trafalgar in 1805. He had been in receipt of an Admiralty pension from 1871.

39 - Douglas Wills, a surgeon in Cumnock, died on 30th September, 1848 - "a victim of his zeal in the cause of humanity".

95 - One Crichton family stone reveals that two of their sons were marine engineers, who both died at sea. Robert, 3rd Engineer on SS Retriever left Salonika on 22nd December, 1871, and "was never heard of again". His brother James, 4th Engineer on SS Killarne also died at sea on 2nd January, 1880.

297 - William Simson was born at Tenpoundland, near Ochiltree, in 1758 and studied at Glasgow University. He became the schoolmaster of Ochiltree in 1780, and then transferred to Cumnock in 1788. He died in 1815, age 57. He wrote a number of poems - including one to Robert Burns - who replied with his Epistle to William Simson in May 1785. Burns probably visited William in Cumnock and he gave him his name of Winsome Willie. William Simson died in 1815 and the stone is inscribed with a poem by Adam Brown Todd; "Here Winsome Willie lies whose worth in Burns woke equal. In love and death when wrenched the ties on earth has knit them now above."

301 - A square-sectioned pillar reveals a unique, lengthy, and glowing tribute to a wife, who appears to have been the paragon of all virtues. Ann Menzies, daughter of Adam Menzies of Troloss, and spouse of Isaac Johnston, merchant in Cumnock, is lauded as follows:- "For goodness of heart, free of all guile. For sincere honesty. As a friend. For Faithful affection as a wife. For preferring domestic happiness and decent economy to dissipated profusion. Equalled by few. Surpassed by none in justice to her worthy character. From the constant experience of eleven years, this conclusive testimony is inscribed by her afflicted husband as the last pledge of his heartfelt duty and most tender regard. She died May 20, 1776, aged 36 years."

308 - Another stone marks the grave of James Taylor, 'the inventor of steam navigation', who died in 1825. Claims may be made that other people invented steam navigation, but it is well recorded that Taylor, assisted Patrick Miller and William Symington in the first successful effort to sail a boat powered by steam. Their boat traveled at 5 miles per hour on Dalswinton Loch in 1788. It is believed that Robert Burns - our National Bard - witnessed this 'voyage', - indeed it has been suggested that he may even have traveled on the boat. Taylor was a brilliant man, and he was afterwards brought to Cumnock by the Earl of Dumfries to develop coal-mining, industry, and transport and to set up the Cumnock Pottery on Glaisnock Street.

323 - Fairly near the Simson stone is the grave of Annie Merry, wife of John Merry, Vintner, in Cumnock. Annie, as a young girl, was the Annie Ranken, who inspired Burns to compose the famous The Rigs O Barley, or Corn Rigs which is still enthusiastically sung at many a Burns Supper.

"It was upon a Lammas night, when corn rigs are bonie, beneath the moon's unclouded light, I held awa' to Annie; The time flew by, wi' tentless heed; Till, 'tween the late and early, wi' sma' persuasion she agreed to see me thro' the barley.

Corn rigs, an' barley rigs, an' corn rigs are bonie; I'll ne'er forget that happy night, among the rigs wi' Annie.

The sky was blue, the wind was still, the moon was shining clearly; I set her down, wi' right good will, among the rigs o' barley: I ken't her heart was a' my ain; I lov'd her most sincerely; I kiss'd her owre and owre again, among the rigs o' barley.

I lock'd her in my fond embrace; Her heart was beating rarely: My blessings on that happy place, among the rigs o' barley! But by the moon and stars so bright, that shone that hour so clearly! She ay shall bless that happy night among the rigs o' barley.

I hae been blythe wi' comrades dear; I hae been merry drinking; I hae been joyfu' gath'rin' gear; I hae been happy thinking: But a' the pleasures e'er I saw, tho' three times doubl'd fairly... That happy night was worth them a', among the rigs o' barley."

411 - Sergeant John Ranken, 7th son of George Ranken of Whitehill was killed while leading his company in an attack on the Wattygoon Stockade, near Prome in the Burmese Territory in 16th November, 1825, aged 23.

479 - At the beginning of 1833 a band of organised poachers, believed to be from the Glasgow area, were apprehended by a group of local voluntary constables and kept at the Dumfries Arms hostelry. Consequently a group of about 300 local supporters set free one of the poachers and in the ensuing riot, David Reid a Mason from Barshare and one of the constables, was shot dead. His wife Marion Murdoch erected a headstone in memory of her husband and his tragic death.

534 - The inscription on this covenanting tombstone, believed to have been erected by Robert Paterson 'Old Mortality' reads "Here lyes David Dun and Simon Paterson who was shot in this place by a party of highlanders for their adherence to the word of God and the covenanted work of the Reformation 1685." Dun is said to be from Closs, in Ochiltree - others say he may be from Selkirkshire.

529 - Thomas Richard was a tenant farmer at Greenock Mains, near Muirkirk. At the age of 80 he was taken from his farm by Peter Inglis and brought to trial at Cumnock under Colonel Douglas. He was executed as a covenanter in Cumnock Square on 5th April 1685. His corpse was taken to the Gallows Knowe (normally used for criminals) and he is the first covenanter buried on this spot.

There are, no doubt, many other interesting epitaphs to be discovered on a visit to this ancient necropolis.

Notes to the inscriptions

[] - Denotes information no longer readable on the headstone or is from the original 1970/80's document.

•• - Denotes numbers which are not recorded or illegible.

Notes on condition of headstones are in *italics*.

Placenames, first names and surnames are correct as on headstone.

Headstones that are marked as *inaccessible* or *overgrown* have not been checked. These will be completed in the near future and re-published on the site.

The **bold** number before each inscription corresponds to the headstone numbers on the maps.

Notes to the cemetery maps

The original inscriptions included maps of each cemetery with numbered headstones and other information. We have updated these maps and these can be found at the end of this document. As the headstones mainly face East we have oriented the headstone numbers for easy reading while looking at the inscriptions if you visit the cemetery.

We have produced five maps of Cumnock old cemetery; an overall map showing the four sections then a map of each section which are easier to navigate and have larger headstone numbers.

We have tried to give an accurate scale and position for each headstone but since this has been done by eye there might be a few inaccuracies. If so please let us know and we will update any information which has been passed to us.





1 – McLatchie. Dalzell. Reid. Willock.

Erected by William McLatchie, Wright.

In memory of Janet Dalzell his wife who died 16th June 1841 aged 43 years.

Also of his father Hugh McLatchie, Mason who died March 1843 aged 86 years.

Also of his mother Agnes Reid who died January 1848 aged 82 years.

And of Robert his son who died 18th February 1855 aged 18 years.

Also of his grand son William Willock who died 16th January 1857 4 years and 2 months.

Also of the said William McLatchie who died 21st July 1862 aged 66 years.

Badly overgrown with ivy.

2 – McLatchie. Hunter.

In memory of Andrew McLatchie, Mason.

Who died October the 13th 1810.

And of Janet Hunter his spouse who died March 16th 1813.

Also of Andrew McLatchie who died 30th September 1824 aged 29 years.

And John McClatchie, Mason and Hugh McClatchie, Shoemaker, three sons of the late Hugh McLatchie, Mason, Drumbrochen.

3 – Crawford. McLellan.

Robert Crawford. Weaver, Townhead, Cumnock.

Who died September 1854 aged 73 years, His wife Isabella McLellan died December 1847 aged 68 years.

Their daughters Jane died 1811 aged 7 years.

Isabella died March 1825 aged 14 years.

Mary died July 1825 aged 19 years.

4 – Robb.

Erected by Charles Robb.

In memory of his father John [of Glasgow and Dumfries] who died 26th April 1845 aged 51 years.

Also of his [other] brother James Robb who died 20th June 1845 aged 26 years.

Broken in half, semi-buried and quite damaged at the top.

5 – Simpson. Robertson. Goldie. McGeachin.

Erected by John Simpson, Mason.

In memory of his children Marion Maxwell who died 31st July 1833 aged 16 months

The above John Simpson who died 7th May 1889 aged 81 years.

Jane Robertson his widow who died 21st September 1889 aged 79 years.

Also of his grandchildren John Goldie who died in infancy 1871.

John Simpson Goldie who died 18th January 1872 aged 14 months.

Hugh McGeachin who died 25th June [1875] aged 10 years.

His daughter Mary, wife of Thomas Goldie who died 5th January 1882 aged 38 years.



6 – Hair.

Erected by Andrew Hair.

In memory of his son William who died 8th March 1871 aged 9 years.

The above Andrew Hair died at Kilmarnock 22nd November 1892 aged 59 years.

His daughter Kate died at Kilmarnock 29th January 1896 aged 23 years.

His end was Peace.

7 – Gibson. Richmond. Reid.

John Gibson.

In memory of his son Charles who died 9th June 1885 aged 2 months.

Also of his mother Barbara Richmond who died 19th February 1872 aged 59 years.

The above John Gibson died 7th August 1908 aged 34 years.

Charlotte Reid widow of the above who died at Cumnock 4th December 19[16] aged 77 years.

Stone facing coming loose at bottom. Lean to the right.

8 – Bryan. Blair. Vallance.

Sacred to the memory of John Bryan.

Who died 27th December 1884 aged 63 years.

Also of his wife Christina Baird who died 29th April 1848 aged 28 years.

And of their daughter Elizabeth Vallance who died 18th October 1870 aged 22 years.

And of their sons James 2nd December 1895 aged 54 years.

John who died 2nd October 1906 aged 60 years and was interred in Comely Bank Cemetery Edinburgh.

9 – Bryan. Munn. Baird.

Sacred to the memory of James Bryan.

Who died 11th February 1862 aged 38 years.

Also of his wife Elizabeth Munn who died 17th January 1909 aged 84 years.

Also of his daughter Annie and of his son William who died in infancy.

Also their daughter Christina Baird who died 24th November 1943 aged 94 years.

Badly overgrown and quite eroded.

10 – Young. Samson. Rorrison.

Erected by [Agnes] Young, Hillhouse.

In memory of her husband John Samson who died [26th] December 1838 aged 48 years.

The above Agnes Young [who died 30th January] 1882 aged 90 years.

Also of their son John who died John 29th October 1898 aged 80 years.

And [his wife] Margaret Rorrison [who died] 21st March 1916 aged 86 years.

Also Joan Samson daughter of Margaret Samson who died 6th August 1923 aged 62 years.

Badly Eroded in parts.

11 – Duncan. Cowan.

Erected by William Duncan, Merchant.

In memory of his sister Jessie who died 16th February 1875 aged 38 years.

And of his children.

Jane who died 30th April 1875 aged 10 months.

Andrew died 24th November 1876 aged 10 months.

Henry Cowan died 7th August 1881 aged 6 months.

Also his beloved wife Herries Cowan died 24th December 1893 aged 53 years.

The above William Duncan [rest missing].

Overtured before. Now upright.

12 – Richmond. Corse. Findlay.

[Erected by Andrew Richmond]

His father [illegible] Richmond.

Who died 9th October [illegible] aged 42 years.

His mother [Margaret] [Corse] who died 13th October [illegible] aged 53 years.

His wife [Catherine] Findlay who died 18th [April] [1878] aged [38] years.

Peter and Annie Bowie Richmond who died in infancy.

The above Andrew Richmond died 11th August [1811] aged 52 years.

Badly eroded. Missing top.

13 – McMillan. Howat.

Alexander McMillan.

In memory of his daughter Mary Campbell who died 22nd December 1864 aged 12 ½ years.

The above Alexander McMillan died 28th July 1881 aged 67 years.

[Agnes Howat his wife who died at Glasgow 12th February 1897 aged 49 years.]

14 – Torrance.

Erected by James Torrance.

In memory of his daughter Mary who died in infancy.

Also the above James Torrance, Flesher, Cumnock who died 25th June 1831 aged 40 years.

15 – Unknown.

Only a few words visible. Very badly eroded.

16 – McCowan. Hart. Crichton.

This is the burial place of William McCowan, Caponacre.
In memory of Hugh his infant son who died 12th December 1813.
Of Elizabeth his daughter who died 5th October 1825 aged 18 years.
Of Charles his infant son who died 6th April 1825.
Of James who died in Adelaide, South Australia on the 25th May 1839 aged 20 years.
And of the said William McCowan who died 19th November 1839 aged 62 years.
And of Jean Hart his wife who died at Hartfield, Cumnock on 9th December 1870 aged 85 years.
Also John McCowan, Chief Magistrate of Cumnock 1878–81. Son of the said William McCowan who died at Hartfield, Cumnock 25th September 1884 in his 74th year.
And Elizabeth Crichton his wife who died at Hartfield, Cumnock 4th April 1883 in her 72nd year.
James McCowan son of the said John McCowan and Elizabeth Crichton died at Bonny River Western Africa on 27th February 1870 in his 24th year.
On plinth: Also Robert McCowan son of the said John McCowan and Elizabeth Crichton who died on 2nd May 1922 in his [78th] year.

Inaccessible. Very badly overgrown.

Sacred to the memory of Mrs Regina Dalt.
Who died 6th •••• 1827 aged 72 years.
Husband Daniel Cameron.
Inaccessible. Very badly overgrown.

20 – Crawford.

Erected by James Crawford.
In memory of his father Quintin Crawford, Merchant [in] Cumnock who died 18th December [1845 aged 43 years].
Also his brother [John] who died 20th November 1834 [aged 6 years].
Badly marked with lichen and damaged.

21 – Swan. Pagan.

In memory of James Swan, Darmolloch who died 19th July 1817.
Also William Swan his son who died 17th March 1825.
Robert Swan his son died 2nd November 1848 aged 65 years.
Also Janet Pagan his wife who died 19th May 1831.
Also his sister Jean who died 10th September 1850 aged 91 years.
Also his daughter Jean who died 30th August 1853 aged 60 years.
And his daughter Margaret who died 12 December 1872 aged 82 years.

Also of his mother Agnes Maxwell who died 5th January 1849 aged 52 years.
And of his maternal grandmother Agnes Black who died 9th January 1864 aged 93 years.
Off plinth and leaning on wall.

31 – McMillan. Mitchel.

Erected by Mary Maxwell McMillan.
In memory of her mother Jean Mitchel who died 16th March 1833 aged 86 years.
And her father John McMillan, Tailor Cumnock who died 23rd October 1837 aged 96 years.
Slight damage to sides.

[He] died on the 30th September 1848 aged 53 years. A victim of his zeal in the cause of humanity. His extensive knowledge of medical science, his unrelenting attention to the welfare of those placed under his care, his disinterested services and kindness to the poor, and the uprightness and integrity of his private character, secured for him the entire confidence of those who required his aid, and the respect and esteem of all them who knew him. Wife Elizabeth Campbell died 21st November 1851 aged 40 years.]
Inaccessible and completely overgrown.

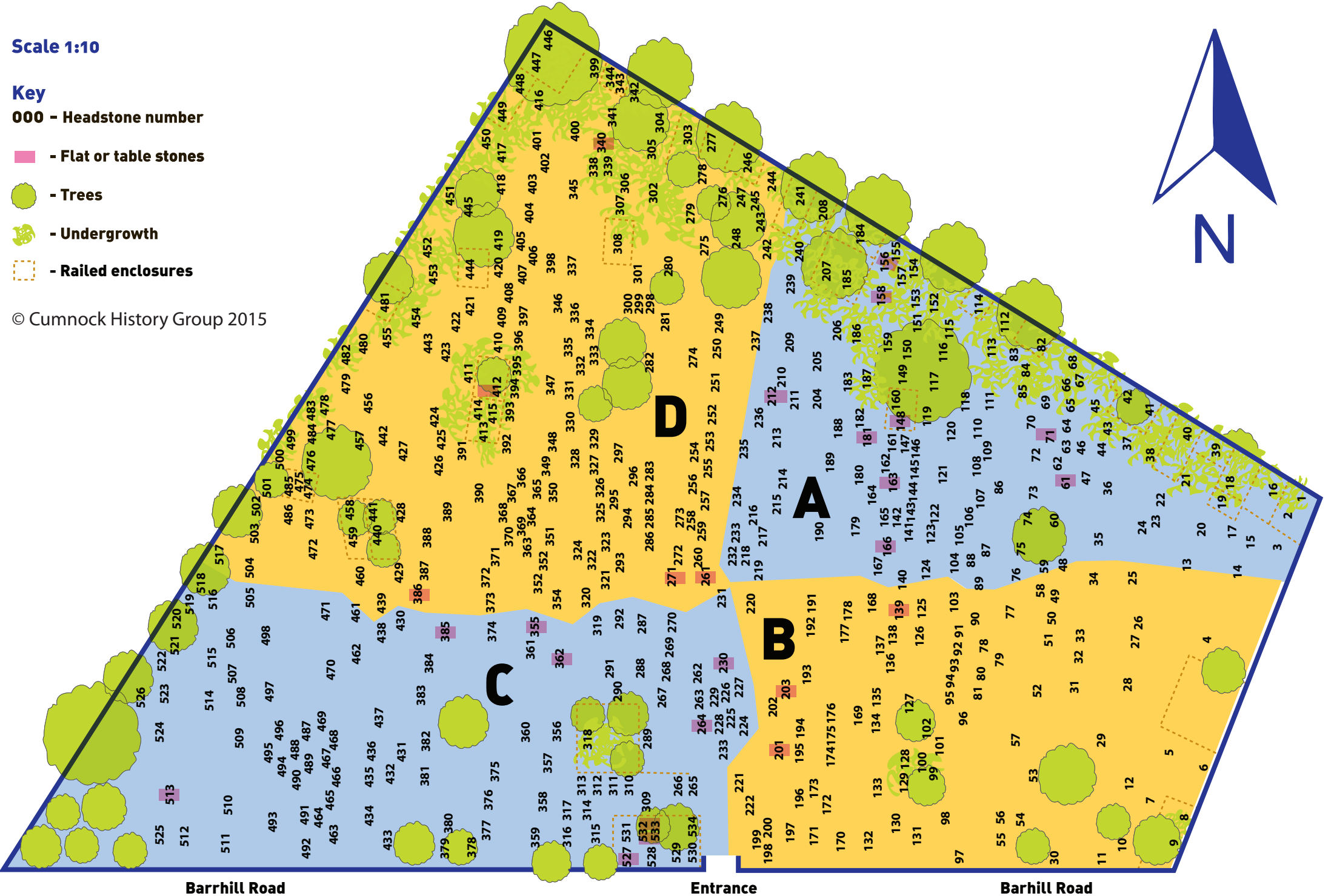
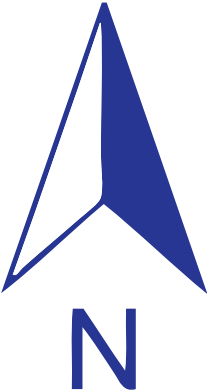
Cumnock Old Cemetery Monumental Inscriptions Map
