By The Way . . .

THE ROYAL HOTEL, now on the Approved Lists of the Automobile Association and the Royal Automobile Club, was granted a Licence in November, 1957. A complete Hotel Service can now be provided.

THE NEW BAKERY, at present under construction alongside the existing premises, when completed early in 1958, will be one of the most modern of its kind in the county. In addition to our normal lines, it is hoped to introduce the production of morning rolls for delivery with the milk.

OTHER PROJECTS in mind, include the re-arrangement of our premises in The Square to provide a more commodious Shop and a Snack Bar Service of the type now so popular in the Cities.
