## Visit to the Before and After Coal Exhibition

Explore the history and lasting impact of coal through photographs and voices from Scottish mining communities. In 1982, American photographer Milton Rogovin came to Scotland to photograph Scottish miners at their pits, in their homes, and during their leisure time. Forty years on from the Miners' Strike in 1984, the artist Nicky Bird has updated Rogovin's documentation by meeting with individuals and families connected with the original photographs. The exhibition closes on 23rd August so we're planning a group visit on 14 August 2025 at the Baird Institute at 5 pm followed by a bite to eat at the Royal Hotel 1906 restaurant.
