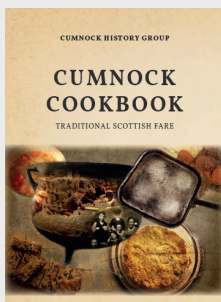

In September Kay McMeekin gave a talk on the Cumnock Kirk Sessions records from 1816-60 which she transcribed with help from Alan Craig and Yvonne Saunderson. In October we had our AGM. Christine Barrie and Louise Quinn stood down as committee members and we thank them for their service. Robert Stevenson was elected on to the committee. Otherwise no change. The next AGM will be in May in line with what we did pre-Covid.

In November, member James Kleboe spoke about the history of the mill town of Catrine and showed an excellent film that was made about Catrine a few years ago.

Last week Rab Wilson, the author and poet from New Cumnock, spoke about the life of John Johnston who lived to the age of 99 in Cumnock. He was a veteran of Trafalgar and wrote a poem "Lord Nelson" about the battle. He latterly was schoolmaster at Benston School and Adam B. We are grateful to all our speakers for giving their time and sharing their knowledge with us. Forthcoming meetings on the sidebar.

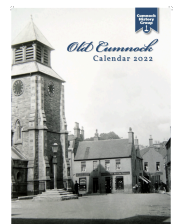
Merchandise

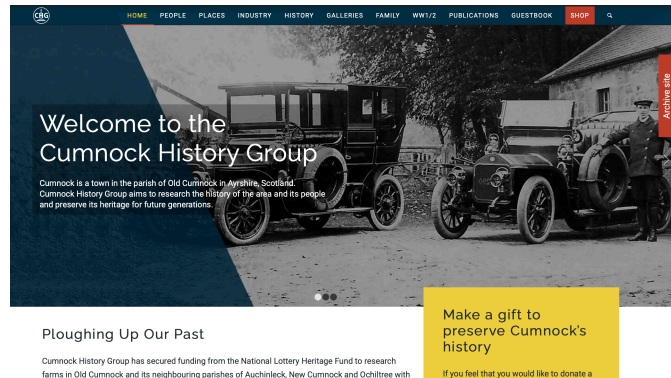

Ploughing Up Our Past

We are working on the write up of the project in which we have investigated 422 farms in the four parishes of Old and New Cumnock, Ochiltree and Auchinleck and conducted 14 interviews. We will be working with East Ayrshire Leisure Trust to showcase our findings in an exhibition in the Baird Institute in May - August this year. We will be looking for local farming objects, eg shepherd's crooks, milking stools, medals, trophies, tacks, and photographs to put on display, safely in cases.
